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<sup>1</sup> You can increase the difficulty of this page by having your children read *down* the columns and not just across the rows. Notice how such an exercise forces them to pay attention to the ending sounds as well as the beginning letters.

<sup>2</sup> Again we have a double consonant. It makes the same sound as a single consonant. Also, review the fact that all proper names must be capitalized. Have your child point to the proper names on this page (Ann, Dan, Jan, Nan, Tad, Cam, Pam, Sam).
