→ the closest example I can come up with is something like sweatshops or electronics facilities in Asia: horrible working conditions, but better than what the people would otherwise have, and the cheap labor provides Americans with cheap clothes and cheap computers; however, I don't think that it would ever be appropriate to say, "I had to sin just a little to have this better outcome": it seems that believers should avoid sin

9. As shocking as Pilate's unjust conviction is, what makes Agrippa's question, "Haven't you ever condemned an innocent man?"
