5-Minute Mechanics

In the same way that verbs must agree in number (singluar or plural) with the subject of a sentence, pronouns must also agree in number with their antecedents. Most of the time, this isn't too difficult:

Jason carefully placed his model on the shelf.

Grandma and Grandpa spent *their* anniversary trip in San Diego.

It is easy to run into agreement problems, however, when you need to use singular pronoun that could refer to either a boy or a girl. For example:

A child should visit _____ dentist by the time _____ is three years old.

You could use *his* and *he* in the blank above, but what if the child is a little girl? It is very easy to be tempted to write:

A child should visit **their** dentist by the time **they** are three years old.

...but what's the problem? *They* is a plural pronoun, and the word *child* is singular. Unfortunately, English does not have a gender-non-specific singular pronoun. If it is important that the gender of the subject remain neutral, rewrite the subject to make it plural: <u>Children</u> should visit **their** dentist by the time **they** are three years old.
