Eastern Hemisphere Updated Timeline Figures & Assignments

Week 1, Day 1

Core F World Book Encyclopedia Rationale

The Eastern Hemisphere Instructor's Guide uses the World Book Encyclopedia to teach children how to do basic research. They'll look to the encyclopedia to answer various questions while they gain an overview of the region they're visiting, but we also invite you to use the assignments to encourage some basic (supervised) research. As your children read about each country or region in the World Book® (DVD), they will write down things they found interesting, and the "Notebook Pages" start the process by providing questions. Encourage them to use these pages in a way that will help them remember what they read, but then ask them to look deeper into each significant event, using alternative websites or books, to better understand how and why it helped shape the region's history. Using the assignments to move beyond the required readings will not only improve their research skills, but it will build on the context for whatever historical and cultural topic they are looking at. This will start to prepare them, while building confidence, to develop academic research skills they will need in the years ahead.

Using the World Book Encyclopedia

There are many helpful features of the World Book Encyclopedia. Spend some time exploring the program to learn about those features. Each time an article is scheduled, have your children locate the article with that title and read the portion scheduled. The first few times, help your children locate the article. The best way we have found to do this is to search by topic. To do this, click on the "Topics" icon on the main menu. There you will see the "Search Tools" and you will be able to search by topic. Here you can enter in part or all of the article title. Usually the first result entry is the one you will need, however you may need to look through all the results to find the right article.

Note: During the time covered in your reading, Scotsman Eric Liddell was born in China and had returned, after becoming an Olympic-winning athlete, to work as a missionary. Like his parents, he served in extremely poor areas of China that had suffered during the country's civil wars and areas that had become particularly treacherous from invading Japanese. Liddell's Olympic career, along with the religious convictions that influenced him, is depicted in the Oscar-winning 1981 film Chariots of Fire.
